Founded: 1904

Location: In Whitman County on State Hwy 23.

Proximity: 52 miles south of Spokane. 120 miles north-east of Walla Walla and 246 miles southeast of Seattle.

Elevation: 1,950 feet.

Population: 650 within city limits. 40,000 within county.

Growing Season: About 180 days.

Ground Transportation: Transportation service – Council on Aging. Rail service by Palouse River Railroad.

Air Transportation: 1,500 ft. private airstrip. Spokane International Airport: 50 miles.

Hospital: Colfax (23 miles)

Medical: Full service clinic staffed by two physicians, three nurses and on-call EMT's.

Telephone: City and rural areas are connected by over 260 miles of buried cable.

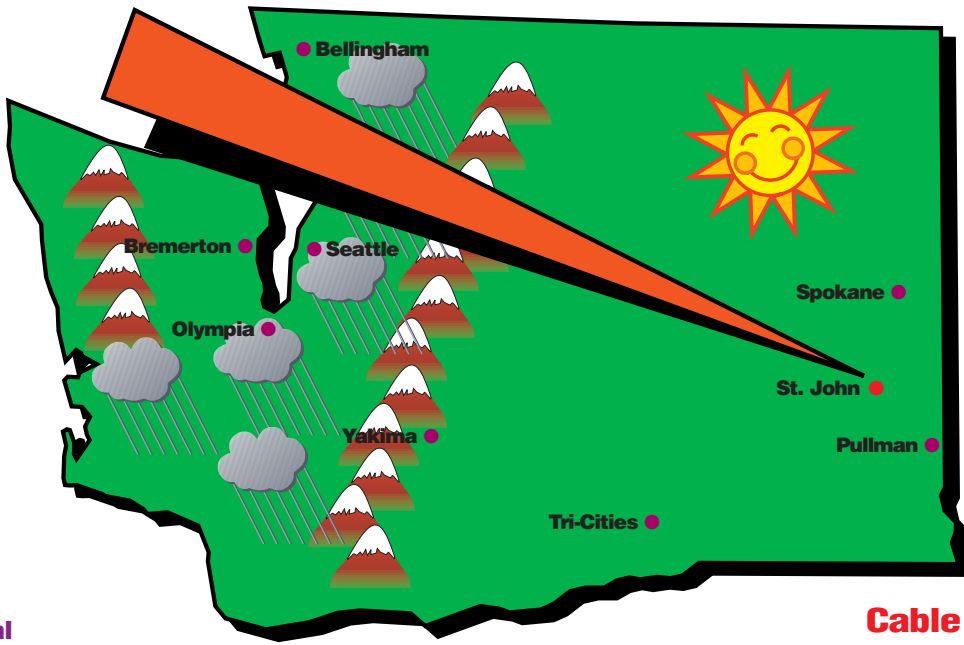
Cable: Featuring seven local stations and 47 total cable channels.

Utilities: Water provided by the City of St. John. Natural gas provided by Avista. Electricity provided by Avista and Inland Power & Light.

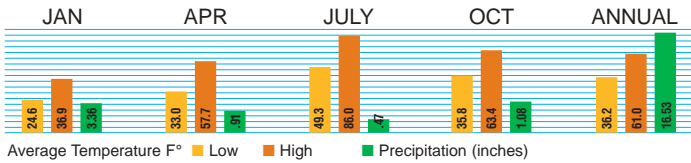
Shipping: U.S. Postal Service. United Parcel Service. Fedex. Airborne. Various truck lines.
